1 egg

2 tablespoons milk

Bacon

3/4 cup cheese

1/4 cup chopped onion greens

**1 -16 oz Flaky layered refrigerated Original Biscuits
(Pillsbury Grand)**



Spray baking dish. Cut biscuits into 8, then into quarters. Fold in egg mixture then coat evenly. Mix in bacon, cheese and onion. Bake at 350 degrees for 23-28 minutes.
